### Competition Aim

To provide members with the opportunity to put their training to the test by judging high quality livestock and carcasses and presenting their findings to industry experts. Members are provided with constructive feedback and advice from the industry experts for their future development.

### Learning outcomes

Judging skills including: observation, understanding of the make-up of the animal and market demands. Communication skills, presentation skills and time keeping.

### 1. DATE & VENUE

1.1. After the County Final, the National Final will be held at the English Winter Fair, Staffordshire Showground on 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> November, 2024. Exact timetable to be confirmed.

### 2. REPRESENTATION

2.1. Counties may enter **two** teams of **two** competitors (Intermediate & Senior) per 600 members or part thereof in the National Final.

### 3. ELIGIBILITY

3.1. A team shall consist of two (2) members. One competitor must be 21 years of age or under and the second competitor must be 28 years of age or under on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2024 and full members of a Club affiliated to NFYFC.

### 4. PROCEDURE

4.1. Competitors will judge two groups of live Pig in Part I and two groups of carcasses in Part II as follows:

#### 4.2. Part I – Live

4.2.1. Place a group of four Pig in order of merit

4.2.2. Place a group of four Pig in order of merit and give reasons for those placings

#### 4.3. Part II – Carcase

4.3.1. Place a group of four Pig carcasses in order of merit.

4.3.2. Place a group of four Pig carcasses in order of merit and give reasons for those placings

4.4. The live animals and carcasses will be designated A, B, X, Y.

4.5. Competitors may handle the live Pigs but only in such a way that they do not cause bruising. Excessive handling after a caution from the stewards will result in disqualification.

4.6. Handling of the carcasses is **NOT ALLOWED**.

4.7. Judging in both rings will operate simultaneously.

4.8. In the carcase judging section, competitors may arrive at their placings by using the following scale of marks as an aid:

Proportion of lean to fat	25
Fullness of eye muscle	25
Shape of leg	20
Lightness of shoulder	10
Firmness and whiteness of fat	5
Colour and texture of flesh	<u>15</u>

## 5. TIMING

### 5.1.1. Live Assessment

Ten minutes judging - handling allowed (in groups)

At least Five minutes – preparing reasons, before being called at random to the judge

### 5.1.2. Carcase Judging & Classification

Ten minutes judging

At least Five minutes – preparing reasons, before being called at random to the judge

### 5.1.3. Reasons

Up to two minutes will be allowed for each competitor to give his or her reasons to the Judge in both the live and carcass sections. Two marks will be deducted for each fifteen seconds (or part thereof) that a competitor goes over the allotted two minutes. The marks will be deducted from the competitor's total.

## 1. AWARDS

- 1.1. English Winter Fair Trophy, Prize Card and Prize Money from Kerbl/Rutland Fencing.
- 1.2. Winter Fair prize card to 2nd and 3rd place.
- 1.3. NFYFC Certificates of Achievement will be awarded to all competitors.

## 2. NOTES

- 2.1. During the competition, competitors may not have with them any papers or literature other than the placing cards provided.
- 2.2. When stating reasons, competitors may use only the NOTES SECTION on the official cards provided. These notes are intended for reference only and the competitors who read their notes verbatim to the Judges will be penalised.
- 2.3. Mobile phones are not to be used once the competition has started – if found to be using them this will be an automatic disqualification.
- 2.4. Competitors in the NFYFC competitions are not eligible to take part in the Staffordshire and Birmingham Agricultural Society competition on the Sunday.
- 2.5. During the period of the competition, competitors must not communicate directly or indirectly with any person other than Judges and Stewards under penalty of disqualification.
- 2.6. **IMPORTANT:** Competitors are reminded to read carefully the General Rules relating to National Competitions if they are taking part in this Competition. These are available from the NFYFC website
- 2.7. Members will be disqualified if they are not at the Presentation of Awards without prior permission being granted.
- 2.8. Competitors must provide themselves with white coats, which must be worn during the period of the competition and at the Presentation of Awards, Club, County and Sponsor logs are permitted on either the front or back of the coats.
